Journal Entry:

...'I instructed you to take the key to Tallinn and the breakthrough 'stone' with you on this trip and you did and you rightly related them to Proverbs chapter 21.

Interpreting hope is releasing hope at the heart level...at a life giving level...a seminal level. Interpreting hope 'injects hope into the inner man' in the hidden places of the heart.

Interpreting hope frees people to allow their empty vessels to be filled. It enables them to see the difference between a 'use-less' empty vessel and one that simply has not yet been filled. Remember your word to Tina...interpreting hope brings a fullness that irons out the 'creases' that time has burned into the garment of your memory. The disappointments and disillusionments wrinkle your perspective and cripple your hope. But when hope is interpreted to the human heart healing, encouragement and energy are released and there is a fresh connection to the future once again.

Interpreting hope and breakthrough are vitally connected. Release one and you reap the other one.
