

LEANING IN AND LOOKING AHEAD - PART II

¹Paul and Silvanus and Timothy, **To the church of the Thessalonians in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ: Grace to you and peace.**²We give thanks to God always for all of you, making mention of you in our prayers; ³constantly bearing in mind your work of faith and labor of love and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ in the presence of our God and Father, ⁴knowing, brethren beloved by God, His choice of you; ⁵for our gospel did not come to you in word only, but also in power and in the Holy Spirit and with full conviction; just as you know what kind of men we proved to be among you for your sake. **I Thessalonians 1:1-5 NASB**

- Paul and his team consistently ‘make mention’ of the Thessalonians in prayer.
 - You can do this! You can make mention of people by name at the throne of grace.
 - Speaking to God on behalf of others...mentioning their name in His presence ‘counts’ with God.
- When they pray for the church, they have three things in mind...recalling unceasingly before our God and Father your work energized by faith and service, motivated by love and unwavering hope in [the return of] our Lord Jesus Christ (the Messiah). **I Thessalonians 1:3 Amplified Bible**
 - Work energized by faith (see **I John 5:4-5**). Faith is rooted in the past and empowered in the present by love. (See **II Corinthians 5:14-16, John 13:34-35, Hebrews 10:24-25, I Peter 1:22, Ephesians 4:32**)
 - Unwavering hope
 - We hope for His coming and in His ‘coming through’ for us.
 - Hope is the ‘helmet’. (**I Thessalonians 5:8**) that guards your thoughts so your heart does not get poisoned, stolen, or ‘stopped’.
 - Knox calls hope...‘unwearied love’ and Goodspeed says...‘unwavering expectancy.’
 - The ‘helmet’ is ‘sonscreen’ for the ‘toxic rays’ of the enemy’s lies.

For the word of the Lord has sounded forth from you, not only in Macedonia and Achaia, but also in every place your faith toward God has gone forth, so that we have no need to say anything. **I**

Thessalonians 1:8 NASB

- v8...“The Word of the Lord has ‘sounded forth’ from you....‘sounded forth’ only appears once in the Bible and it is here in v8.
- Sounded forth means to resound, ring out.
- ...“For from you these has been caused to sound forth in a loud, unmistakable proclamation the word of the Lord, the echo of which still rolls on with a great sound...”

⁹For they themselves report about us what kind of a reception we had with you, and how you turned to God from idols to serve a living and true God, ¹⁰and to wait for His Son from heaven, whom He raised from the dead, *that is* Jesus, who rescues us from the wrath to come. **I Thessalonians 1:9-10 NASB**

LEANING IN AND LOOKING AHEAD - PART II

- They turned to God from idols to serve a living and true God.
- Idols – images or false gods.
- Idols – anything that takes the place of God – my opinions, false teachings, religious novelties, ungodly desires, and practices.
- Idols – things that are not immortal or eternal and are not true.
- They were ‘leaning into life and looking ahead.’
- And [how you] look forward to *and* await the coming of His Son from heaven, Whom He raised from the dead-Jesus, Who personally rescues *and* delivers us out of *and* from the wrath [bring punishment] which is coming [upon the impenitent] *and* draws us to Himself [investing us with all the privileges and rewards of the new life in Christ, the Messiah]. **I Thessalonians 1:10 Amplified Bible**
- They had an eye on His return and our rescue from the wrath to come.

⁴who gave Himself for our sins so that He might rescue us from this present evil age, according to the will of our God and Father, ⁵to whom *be* the glory forevermore. Amen. **Galatians 1:4-5 NASB**

- We also have Jesus who rescues us from this present evil age.
- Rescue means deliver, take out or set free.

⁹“The patriarchs became jealous of Joseph and sold him into Egypt. *Yet* God was with him, ¹⁰and rescued him from all his afflictions, and granted him favor and wisdom in the sight of Pharaoh, king of Egypt, and he made him governor over Egypt and all his household. **Acts 7:9-10 NASB**

- The Thessalonians were ‘leaning in’ to God’s purpose by their energized faith and empowered love, looking ahead with envisioned hope.

¹For you yourselves know, brethren, that our coming to you was not in vain, ²but after we had already suffered and been mistreated in Philippi, as you know, we had the boldness in our God to speak to you the gospel of God amid much opposition. ³For our exhortation does not *come* from error or impurity or by way of deceit; ⁴but just as we have been approved by God to be entrusted with the gospel, so we speak, not as pleasing men, but God who examines our hearts. ⁵For we never came with flattering speech, as you know, nor with a pretext for greed—God is witness— ⁶nor did we seek glory from men, either from you or from others, even though as apostles of Christ we might have asserted our authority. ⁷But we proved to be gentle among you, as a nursing *mother* tenderly cares for her own children. ⁸Having so fond an affection for you, we were well-pleased to impart to you not only the gospel of God but also our own lives, because you had become very dear to us. ⁹For you recall, brethren, our labor and hardship, *how* working night and day so as not to be a burden to any of you, we proclaimed to you the gospel of God. ¹⁰You are witnesses, and *so is* God, how devoutly and uprightly and blamelessly we behaved toward you believers; ¹¹just as you know how we *were* exhorting and encouraging and imploring each one of you as a father *would* his own children, ¹²so that you would walk in a manner worthy of the God who calls you into His own kingdom and glory.

13For this reason we also constantly thank God that when you received the word of God which you heard from us, you accepted *it* not *as* the word of men, but *for* what it really is, the word of God, which also performs its work in you who believe. **I Thessalonians 2:1-13 NASB**

- Paul is ‘approved by God’ via a thorough heart examination. (**I Thessalonians 2:1-6**)
 - Paul states his function as a true apostle. (v6)
 - All Apostles are probably spiritual fathers.
 - Not all spiritual fathers are Apostles.
 - Apostolic heart standards
 - Strong character proven through spiritual conflict and opposition. (See **Acts 16:14-20**)
 - Sound teaching that is free from delusion, impurity, and deception. (**I Thessalonians 2:3**)
 - Authentic purpose of pleasing God vs. placating man. (v4)
 - Values free from greed and self-promotion. (v5)
 - Valid God-given authority.
6 Nor did we seek to extract praise and honor and glory from men, either from you or from anyone else, though we might have asserted our authority [stood on our dignity and claimed honor] as apostles (special missionaries) of Christ (the Messiah). I Thessalonians 2:6 Amplified Bible
 - Amplified Bible says that there is an authority, dignity and honor that attends such a ministry.
 - “Nor seeking glory from people – neither from you, nor from others, [although] being able to be with weight as apostles of Christ.” (**Transline New Testament**)
 - True humility of heart is Paul’s ministry. (v1-6)
- Apostolic nurture... (he ‘mothers’ the church) **I Thessalonians 2:7-8**
 - Birthing – bringing forth. (v7)
 - Nursing – providing the sincere milk of the Word.
 - “Feeder” or Mother – only time used in the NT
 - This word means gives warmth to or warms in one’s bosom. (See **Ephesians 5:29** – only two places used in NT).
 - So fond an affection or longing.
 - Only place this word appears in the Bible was found on a gravestone of parents longing for their dead child.
 - Very dear to us...literally ‘beloved’.
- Apostolic nature (he fathers them) **I Thessalonians 2:8-12**
 - He imparts the Gospel through self-sacrifice.
 - He imparts his own ‘life’ to them.
 - He is an example of hard-work, integrity, and blamelessness.

LEANING IN AND LOOKING AHEAD - PART II

- He exhorts, he encourages, he implores, he loves. *10 You are witnesses, [yes] and God [also], how unworldly and upright and blameless was our behavior toward you believers [who adhered to and trusted in and relied on our Lord Jesus Christ]. 11 For you know how, as a father [dealing with] his children, we used to exhort each of you personally, stimulating and encouraging and charging you. 12 To live lives worthy of God, Who calls you into His own kingdom and the glorious blessedness [into which true believers will enter after Christ's return].*

Paul's Parenting Activities

Mothering

Nurtured

Pampered

Delicate touch

He offered acceptance

He mothered them into the way

Fathering

Disciplined training

He expected excellence

He fathered them into the walk

He fathered them into the Army of God

- He brought people to the place of benefit and blessing in God and he turned their hearts to God so that the Lord would receive blessing and glory from them.
- Most importantly, what Paul did to parent this group of people worked! It produced the ultimate result. (v13)
 - 13 And we also [especially] thank God continually for this, that when you received the message of God [which you heard] from us, you welcomed it not as the word of [mere] men, but as it truly is, the Word of God, which is effectually at work in you who believe [exercising its superhuman power in those who adhere to and trust in and rely on it]. **I Thessalonians 2:13 Amplified Bible**
 - The word which is inwardly working itself in you who believe...**The Emphasized NT**
 - ...which has living power in you who have faith...**The NT in Basic English**
 - God's Word which is being constantly set in operation in you who believe...**Wuest NT**

14 For you, brethren, became imitators of the assemblies (churches) of God in Christ Jesus which are in Judea, for you too have suffered the same kind of treatment from your own fellow countrymen as they did [who were persecuted at the hands] of the Jews,

15 Who killed both the Lord Jesus and the prophets, and harassed *and* drove us out, and continue to make themselves hateful *and* offensive to God and to show themselves foes of all men,

16 Forbidding *and* hindering us from speaking to the Gentiles (the nations) that they may be saved. So as always, they fill up [to the brim the measure of] their sins. But God's wrath has come upon them at last [completely and forever]! [Gen. 15:16.]

17 But since we were bereft of you, brethren, for a little while in person, [of course] not in heart, we endeavored the more eagerly and with great longing to see you face to face,

18 Because it was our will to come to you. [I mean that] I, Paul, again and again [wanted to come], but Satan hindered *and* impeded us.

19 For what is our hope or happiness or our victor's wreath of exultant triumph when we stand in the presence of our Lord Jesus at His coming? Is it not you?

20 For you are [indeed] our glory and our joy! **I Thessalonians 2:14-20 AMPC**

- Paul was thrilled at the way the Thessalonians 'received' the Word in their inner being. Now he is expressing the fact that they have truly become a church.
 - "...imitators of the churches of God in Christ Jesus that are in Judea!!" (v14)
 - He knows this is true by how they have embraced the Word and the Holy Spirit working in them even through struggles and difficulties.
 - They were getting flack from their own people, just as the early churches in Judea got from the Jews.
 - Not only were their obstacles for the Thessalonians, but Paul and his team were fighting the enemy as well. (**I Thessalonians 2:18**)
 - Paul says that the believer in Thessalonica were their glory and joy...how fitting! (v19-20)
