# The Deity of Jesus Christ

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. 2He was in the beginning with God. 3All things came into being through Him, and apart from Him nothing came into being that has come into being. 4In Him was life, and the life was the Light of men. 5The Light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not comprehend it. **John 1:1-5 NASB** 

10I have seen the task which God has given the sons of men with which to occupy themselves.

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11He has made everything appropriate in its time. He has also set eternity in their heart, yet so that man will not find out the work which God has done from the beginning even to the end. **Ecclesiastes 3:10-11 NASB** 

Before the mountains were born or You gave birth to the earth and the world, even from everlasting to everlasting, You are God. **Psalm 90:2 NASB** 

- The 'word everlasting' can have a variety of meanings but for our purpose today we will use the definition of 'the beginningless past'.
  - o From 'the beginningless past' to the 'endless future', He is God.
  - In John 1, John is prompting us to experience God in the 'wonderment of His everlastingness'...in the beginning was the Word...(His 'everlasting beginningless')

God created man in His own image, in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them. **Genesis 1:27 NASB** 

- Here is the picture: Jesus is the Living Word with no beginning and no end (He is God).
  - God places 'eternity' in the heart of every person, He has put the desire for 'everlasting beginningless' into every person's heart. We all have a yearning for everlasting life placed in us.
  - Once you discover that pull towards His 'everlastingness' in your heart then the battle is 'on'...we are indwelt with the 'eternity' He places in us...He has made us in His image. So, there is something in God that responds to us and something in us that wants to respond to Him.
- Our brain gets worked up by technological advances, 'new' inventions, and schemes...but they never last, they never satisfy.
  - Our brain tells us that we must have all the latest, newest, and best, but our heart is yearning for 'everlastingness'.
  - Our heart will never be satisfied with the concepts of the brain alone...we have something in us that is seeking 'everlastingness' and nothing else will do.

15Do not love the world nor the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. 16For all that is in the world, the lust of the

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flesh and the lust of the eyes and the boastful pride of life, is not from the Father, but is from the world. 17The world is passing away, and *also* its lusts; but the one who does the will of God lives forever. I John 2:15-17 NASB

V15.."do not love the world or what the world can offer..." 20<sup>th</sup> Century
 New Testament

Stop considering the world precious with the result that you love it, and the things in the world. If anyone as a habit of life is considering the world precious and is therefore loving it, there does not exist the Father's love [i.e., the love possessed by the Father] in him. Because everything which is in the world, the passionate desire of the flesh [the totally depraved nature], and the passionate desire of the eyes, and the insolent and empty assurance which trusts in the things that serve the creature life, is not from the Father as a source but is from the world as a source. And the world is being caused to pass away, and its passionate desire. But the one who keeps on habitually doing the will of God abides forever. I John 2:15-17 Wuest

• The world offers us what is 'cool' and current but in our inner man we want the eternal life that on comes from the eternal God of **John 1**.

God placed eternity in the heart of every person and we can only be fully satisfied by the divine everlastingness of Jesus, the Word made flesh.

14And the Word became flesh, and dwelt among us, and we saw His glory, glory as of the only begotten from the Father, full of grace and truth. 15John \*testified about Him and cried out, saying, "This was He of whom I said, 'He who comes after me has a higher rank than I, for He existed before me.' " 16For of His fullness we have all received, and grace upon grace. 17For the Law was given through Moses; grace and truth were realized through Jesus Christ. 18No one has seen God at any time; the only begotten God who is in the bosom of the Father, He has explained *Him.* John 1:14-18 NASB
