A CRADLE. A TABLE. A CROSS.

- <u>A CRADLE</u>: common...yet profound...
 - A simple manger, a lowly manger. Low enough to accommodate a working-class woman child. Low enough that astonished shepherds could lean in and look <u>upon</u> a baby's radiant face. Low enough to be a perfect fit for a child-like faith.
 - Low enough yet high enough as well...
 - High enough that kings and dignitaries could bow down and look up to see divine life in human form, to gaze upon prophetic fulfillment wrapped in humanity. High enough to cause the wisest and richest to prostrate themselves in worshipful adoration. High enough to create an unceasing sense of wonder in the hearts and minds of scholars and rulers alike.
- A CROSS: a cradle, but also a cross.
 - Rugged and crude, yet magnificent and lofty.
 - Low enough that it could be born on a man's back and burned into his heart. Low enough to bear the curse of sin, that burdens all the inhabitants of the earth. Low enough to pierce the depths of hell and decimate its machinery of hate and death. Low enough for all men to hear the dying words of the Savior's lips..." Father, forgive them, they know not what they do!"
 - Low enough yet high enough as well...
 - High enough. High enough for Jesus to draw all men into Himself. High enough to become the focal point of all human history. High enough to confound and defy human reason. High enough to be the consummate display for Divine Wisdom. High enough for the blood that Jesus shed to cover all the sins of all the people ever born from every nation, tribe, and tongue. High enough for every spiritual power in heavenly places to hear and cringe at the judgement rendered them by these triumphant words spoken from the cross: IT IS FINISHED!
- **<u>A TABLE</u>**: a cradle, a cross, but also a table.
 - Plain and ordinary yet celebrated and honored.
 - Low enough...low enough that all believers of every age could come to it and worship. Low enough to bear the symbols of His death...His purifying blood and His broken body. Low enough to proclaim the sacrificial offering of a sinless life for the iniquities of fallen men. Low enough for all to come and touch and receive.
 - **Low** enough yet **high** enough as well. **High** enough to endure and outlast all the rituals of all the ages. **High** enough to herald the power of life that

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overcame the grave. **High** enough to proclaim the blood that washes clean the impurities of the sinful heart. **High** enough to be the meeting place of a merciful God and a forgiven sinner. **High** enough to cause His Spirit to search our hearts and create right motives within us. **High** enough to represent all that God has done for us in His Son.

A cradle, a table, and a cross.

<u>A Cradle</u>: where a sinless human life came into this world.

A Cross: where that sinless life was given for you and me.

<u>A Table</u>: where we recall <u>that</u> birth, and remember <u>that</u> death, and celebrate the resurrection and ascension that followed.

<u>A Table</u> that links the gift of His life and the gift of His death with the gift of forgiveness of sins and life everlasting.

A cradle, a cross, a table...

Low enough to bring God's life to earth for our salvation, **high** enough to touch us with His power for our transformation.

Low enough to get Him to us, high enough to get us to Him.

A cradle, a cross, a table...this Christmas, may we receive them all, believe them all, and rejoice in them all. He has first loved us that we might forever love and be loved by Him.

A cradle; a cross; a table; these represent far more than a seasonal sentiment or a religious ritual or liturgy. They represent the relational-reality of God; very God, the God of heaven, sending the Spirit of God to live in your life; to take residence in your heart as you place your faith in His son Jesus Christ.
