11Jesus then took the loaves, and having given thanks, He distributed to those who were seated; likewise also of the fish as much as they wanted. 12When they were filled, He *said to His disciples, "Gather up the leftover fragments so that nothing will be lost." 13So they gathered them up, and filled twelve baskets with fragments from the five barley loaves which were left over by those who had eaten. 14Therefore when the people saw the sign which He had performed, they said, "This is truly the Prophet who is to come into the world." 15So Jesus, perceiving that they were intending to come and take Him by force to make Him king, withdrew again to the mountain by Himself alone. John 6:11-15 NASB

- The miracle of the feeding of the 5,000 is in the multiplication of the food but the mode of distribution is so divinely personal and powerful.
 - (v14) The people saw the 'sign', the 'attesting miracle', and said..." truly this is the prophet who is come into the world."
 - Jesus is astute...He knows what is in the hearts of men and He pulls away to the mountains to avoid the crowds demands. (v15)

16Now when evening came, His disciples went down to the sea, 17and after getting into a boat, they started to cross the sea to Capernaum. It had already become dark, and Jesus had not yet come to them. 18The sea began to be stirred up because a strong wind was blowing. 19Then, when they had rowed about three or four miles, they *saw Jesus walking on the sea and drawing near to the boat; and they were frightened. 20But He *said to them, "It is I; do not be afraid." 21So they were willing to receive Him into the boat, and immediately the boat was at the land to which they were going. 22The next day the crowd that stood on the other side of the sea saw that there was no other small boat there, except one, and that Jesus had not entered with His disciples into the boat, but that His disciples had gone away alone. 23There came other small boats from Tiberias near to the place where they ate the bread after the Lord had given thanks. 24So when the crowd saw that Jesus was not there, nor His disciples, they themselves got into the small boats, and came to Capernaum seeking Jesus. 25When they found Him on the other side of the sea, they said to Him, "Rabbi, when did You get here?" 26Jesus answered them and said, "Truly, truly, I say to you, you seek Me, not because you saw signs, but because you ate of the loaves and were filled. 27Do not work for the food which perishes, but for the food which endures to eternal life, which the Son of Man will give to you, for on Him the Father, God, has set His seal." 28Therefore they said to Him, "What shall we do, so that we may work the works of God?" 29Jesus answered and said to them, "This is the work of God, that you believe in Him whom He has sent." John 6:16-29 NASB

• **V20-21**..." But the One says to them I am the One. Stop being afraid..." **N.T. Transline**

Jesus replied, I assure you, most solemnly I tell you, before Abraham was born, I AM. John 8:58 AMPC

- I AM...part of the majesty of Jesus is that He bears the 'divine name'.
- The people say..." What do we do so that we may work to the works of God?? (v28) Jesus responds..." This...is above all the things that God requires that you should believe in Him whom He has sent..." v29 Weymouth N.T.

13 I saw in the night visions, and behold, on the clouds of the heavens came One like a Son of man, and He came to the Ancient of Days and was presented before Him.14 And there was given Him [the Messiah] dominion and glory and kingdom, that all peoples, nations, and languages should serve Him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion which shall not pass away, and His kingdom is one which shall not be destroyed. **Daniel 7:13-14 AMPC**

7Who commands the sun not to shine, and sets a seal upon the stars; 8Who alone stretches out the heavens and tramples down the waves of the sea; **Job 9:7-8 NASB**

29He caused the storm to be still, so that the waves of the sea were hushed. 30Then they were glad because they were quiet, so He guided them to their desired haven. 31Let them give thanks to the LORD for His lovingkindness, and for His wonders to the sons of men! **Psalm 107:29-31 NASB**

30So they said to Him, "What then do You do for a sign, so that we may see, and believe You? What work do You perform? 31Our fathers ate the manna in the wilderness; as it is written, 'HE GAVE THEM BREAD OUT OF HEAVEN TO EAT.' " 32Jesus then said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, it is not Moses who has given you the bread out of heaven, but it is My Father who gives you the true bread out of heaven. 33For the bread of God is that which comes down out of heaven, and gives life to the world." 34Then they said to Him, "Lord, always give us this bread."

35Jesus said to them, "I am the bread of life; he who comes to Me will not hunger, and he who believes in Me will never thirst. 36But I said to you that you have seen Me, and yet do not believe. 37All that the Father gives Me will come to Me, and the one who comes to Me I will certainly not cast out. 38For I have come down from heaven, not to do My own will, but the will of Him who sent Me. 39This is the will of Him who sent Me, that of all that He has given Me I lose nothing, but raise it up on the last day. 40For this

is the will of My Father, that everyone who beholds the Son and believes in Him will have eternal life, and I Myself will raise him up on the last day." John 6:30-40 NASB

• The people are asking for a 'sign' or miracle that would 'out do' Moses and the manna. (v30-31)

30 Therefore they said to Him, what sign (miracle, wonderwork) will You perform then, so that we may see it and believe *and* rely on *and* adhere to You? What [supernatural] work have You [to show what You can do]? 31 Our forefathers ate the manna in the wilderness; as the Scripture says, He gave them bread out of heaven to eat. **John 6:30-31 AMPC**

- Jesus responds to them. (v32-40)
 - o God is the divine Bread giver, <u>not</u> Moses.
 - The True Bread of Life is Jesus.

34 Then they said to Him, Lord, give us this bread always (all the time)!
35 Jesus replied, I am the Bread of Life. He who comes to Me will never be hungry, and he who believes in *and* cleaves to *and* trusts in *and* relies on Me will never thirst any more (at any time).36 But [as] I told you, although you have seen Me, still you do not believe *and* trust *and* have faith. **John 6:34-36 AMPC**

- "Everyone whom the Father gives Me will come to Me, and him who comes to Me I will never on any account drive away." John 6:37
 Weymouth N.T.
- 38 For I have come down from heaven not to do My own will *and* purpose but to do the will *and* purpose of Him Who sent Me. 39 And this is the will of Him Who sent Me, that I should not lose any of all that He has given Me, but that I should give new life *and* raise [them all] up at the last day. 40 For this is My Father's will *and* His purpose, that everyone who sees the Son and believes in *and* cleaves to *and* trusts in *and* relies on Him should have eternal life, and I will raise him up [from the dead] at the last day. John 6:38-40 AMPC
 - Jesus tells us to 'behold' (fix our gaze on Him) and believe in Him and receive eternal life... "The Life of the Ages" Weymouth N.T.

41Therefore the Jews were grumbling about Him, because He said, "I am the bread that came down out of heaven." 42They were saying, "Is not this Jesus, the son of

Joseph, whose father and mother we know? How does He now say, 'I have come down out of heaven'?" 43Jesus answered and said to them, "Do not grumble among yourselves. 44No one can come to Me unless the Father who sent Me draws him; and I will raise him up on the last day. 45It is written in the prophets, 'AND THEY SHALL ALL BE TAUGHT OF GOD.' Everyone who has heard and learned from the Father, comes to Me. 46Not that anyone has seen the Father, except the One who is from God; He has seen the Father. 47Truly, truly, I say to you, he who believes has eternal life. 48I am the bread of life. 49Your fathers ate the manna in the wilderness, and they died. 50This is the bread which comes down out of heaven, so that one may eat of it and not die. 51I am the living bread that came down out of heaven; if anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever; and the bread also which I will give for the life of the world is My flesh."

52Then the Jews *began* to argue with one another, saying, "How can this man give us *His* flesh to eat?" 53So Jesus said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you have no life in yourselves. 54He who eats My flesh and drinks My blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day. 55For My flesh is true food, and My blood is true drink. 56He who eats My flesh and drinks My blood abides in Me, and I in him. 57As the living Father sent Me, and I live because of the Father, so he who eats Me, he also will live because of Me. 58This is the bread which came down out of heaven; not as the fathers ate and died; he who eats this bread will live forever."

59These things He said in the synagogue as He taught in Capernaum. **John 6 41-59 NASB**

- The people complain and grumble (v41-42)
- Jesus replies (v43) "Don't grumble!"

No one is able to come to Me unless the Father Who sent Me attracts *and* draws him *and* gives him the desire to come to Me, and [then] I will raise him up [from the dead] at the last day. **John 6:44 AMPC**

- God's amazing 'drawing power'...He has placed eternity in the heart of every person (see **Ecclesiastes 3:11**) and the Holy Spirit is a 'magnet'.
- Jesus 'lays' it on the line. (John 6:47-52)
- The people say 'what'??

53 And Jesus said to them, I assure you, most solemnly I tell you, you cannot have any life in you unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood [unless you appropriate His life and the saving merit of His blood]. 54 He who feeds on My flesh and drinks My blood has (possesses now) eternal life, and I will raise him up [from the dead] on the last day. **John 6:53-55 AMPC**

- Jesus further exasperates these people who earlier were pushing to make Him their king.
 - o In **v53** He says unless you eat My flesh, you won't have 'life'.
 - In v54 He uses a different word...this word means chewing, munching, crunching, or gnawing...like the sound of eating an apple or raw vegetable.
 Instead of giving a 'spiritual' explanation for His words, He gives an even more graphic 'physical' one.

59These things He said in the synagogue as He taught in Capernaum. 60Therefore many of His disciples, when they heard *this* said, "This is a difficult statement; who can listen to it?" 61But Jesus, conscious that His disciples grumbled at this, said to them, "Does this cause you to stumble? 62*What* then if you see the Son of Man ascending to where He was before? 63It is the Spirit who gives life; the flesh profits nothing; the words that I have spoken to you are spirit and are life. 64But there are some of you who do not believe." For Jesus knew from the beginning who they were who did not believe, and who it was that would betray Him. 65And He was saying, "For this reason I have said to you, that no one can come to Me unless it has been granted him from the Father." 66As a result of this many of His disciples withdrew and were not walking with Him anymore. **John 6:59-66 NASB**

- Jesus speaks to His followers:
 - His followers, His disciples (not to the twelve) Tell Him..."What you say is hard to hear...harsh...hard to accept...offensive".
 - Jesus responds..."does this stumble you? Does this offend you or cause you to fall??"

61But Jesus, knowing within Himself that His disciples were complaining and protesting and grumbling about it, said to them: Is this a stumbling block and an offense to you? [Does this upset and displease and shock and scandalize you?] 62 What then [will be your reaction] if you should see the Son of Man ascending to [the place] where He was before?63 It is the Spirit Who gives life [He is the Life-giver]; the flesh conveys no benefit whatever [there is no profit in it]. The words (truths) that I have been speaking to you are spirit and life.

64 But [still] some of you fail to believe *and* trust *and* have faith. For Jesus knew from the first who did not believe *and* had no faith and who would betray Him *and* be false to Him. 65 And He said, This is why I told you that no one can come to Me unless it is granted him [unless he is enabled to do so] by the Father. **John 6:61-65 AMPC**

- "If I return suddenly to heaven, would this offend you, too?" (v62)
- Jesus is providing the intent of what He spoke in **John 6:53-58**...(**v63**)
- It is the Spirit who gives life. Eating His real flesh and drinking His real blood is purposeless and would not accomplish anything.
- What Jesus speaks has a spiritual life-giving meaning. They are intended and aimed at producing true life in those who 'behold and believe'.
- Many of His 'disciples' decided to withdraw and no longer follow Him. (v64-66)
- Jesus asks the 'twelve'..."Do you want to go, too?" (v67)
- Peter says, "Where would we go...You have the words of eternal life!"

68 Simon Peter answered, Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words (the message) of eternal life. 69 And we have learned to believe *and* trust, and [more] we have come to know [surely] that You are *the Holy One of God*, the Christ (the Anointed One), the Son of the living God. **John 6:68-69 AMPC**

• Peter says, "We believe, and we are 'all in'!"
