CHRISTMAS: WHAT DO YOU THINK OF THAT?

John 3:16, 1 Timothy 3:16

When you hear the word Christmas spoken...what do you think of? Some would say presents, or carols, or Christmas trees and decorations. Some might answer by saying snow, or parties, or friends and family, or no school, or cards, candy, mistletoe, even movies. But what if we can dismiss the thoughts of a white Christmas, of Ebenezer Scrooge, of George Bailey, and Tiny Tim, we will find a wonderful theology that defines Christmas for real. A truth that is life changing, life giving, and never ending.

Beyond question, great is the mystery of godliness: He who was revealed in the flesh, was vindicated in the Spirit, seen by angels, proclaimed among the nations, believed on in the world, taken up in glory. 1 Timothy 3:16 NASB

And great and important and weighty, we confess, is the hidden truth (the mystic secret) of godliness. He [God] was made visible in human flesh, justified and vindicated in the [Holy] Spirit, was seen by angels, preached among the nations, believed on in the world, [and] taken up in glory. 1 Timothy 3:15 AMPC

- The Christmas message is really quite simple!
 - God came to earth in the form of a man.
 - Simply stated...either He came, or He didn't come...
 - Some religious teachers in New Testament times just could not accept the concept that Jesus was actually God in a human body.
 - They thought and they taught that 'matter' was evil, and human flesh is matter, so God could not come in the flesh because He could not be in contact with anything evil.
 - To say that God came to earth in a human body simply was not reasonable, or so they said.
 - Obviously, these are not correct conclusions, and all matter is not evil, but the attempt to turn the incarnation into a simple matter of scientific reason was evil.
 - The secret, the mystery of godliness is not a function of reason. This is a faith issue, a moral spiritual issue.
 - It is interesting to me that the Bible says that unbelief is a sin...this would not be so if belief is only a judgement or verdict, completely based on evidence or reason.
 - There is nothing unreasonable about the message of Christmas, but its appeal is not chiefly to reason.

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- At a real time, in a real place, the real God became a real human and lived among men on the earth.
- Consequently, our response to Jesus coming as the God-man, the man-God is not just a tradition of religious history, it is the reality of a divine person that we can and must come to know.

¹⁴ Therefore, since the children share in flesh and blood, He Himself likewise also partook of the same, that through death He might render powerless him who had the power of death, that is, the devil, ¹⁵ and might free those who through fear of death were subject to slavery all their lives. ¹⁶ For assuredly He does not give help to angels, but He gives help to the descendant of Abraham. ¹⁷ Therefore, He had to be made like His brethren in all things, so that He might become a merciful and faithful high priest in things pertaining to God, to make propitiation for the sins of the people. ¹⁸ For since He Himself was tempted in that which He has suffered, He is able to come to the aid of those who are tempted. Hebrews 2:14-18 NASB

• The 'mystery' of godliness...the incarnation.
