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1 James, a bond-servant of God and of the Lord Jesus Christ, to the twelve tribes who are dispersed abroad: Greetings. ² Consider it all joy, my brethren, when you encounter various trials, ³ knowing that the testing of your faith produces endurance. ⁴ And let endurance have its perfect result, so that you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing. ⁵ But if any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask of God, who gives to all generously and without reproach, and it will be given to him. ⁶ But he must ask in faith without any doubting, for the one who doubts is like the surf of the sea, driven and tossed by the wind. ⁷ For that man ought not to expect that he will receive anything from the Lord, ⁸ being a double-minded man, unstable in all his ways. James 1:1-8 NASB

V1 James (the brother of Jesus)

Bond servant (slave)

"Consider it nothing but joy". (Weymouth)

V2 When you - "Consider it wholly joyful, my brethren, whenever you are enveloped in or encounter trials of any sort or fall into various temptations" (James 1:2 AMPC) - enveloped in or encounter trials of any sort or fall into various temptations.

- The same root word for trials here is used for the word tempted in James 1:13.
 - Various trials...trials of every sort. Knox
 - Surrounded by various temptations...Weymouth
 - ...Testings and temptations. N. T. Transline
 - Trials were things coming from 'the outside' temptations more of an inner struggle.
 - Notice who wrote this...James, the brother of Jesus...can you imagine the 'trials' and/or temptations that he dealt with.
 - Also notice that it doesn't refer here to a trial or a temptation...the concept here is 'various trials, temptation of every sort, the words are plural – more than just one thing to deal with.
- Various trials (for example)
 - Trials that we caused or help create...
 - o Trials/temptations that someone else is responsible for.
 - Trials/temptations that are a family matter.
 - Trials/temptations that threaten your finances.
 - Trials/temptations that threaten the solidarity of your church family...or troubles caused by people in your church family.

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- Trials/temptations that oppose your capacity to obey the will of God or the Word of God.
- Trials, testing/temptations that are in opposition to the safety and security to your home or your homeland.
- Trials, testing/temptations that demand answers and responses to problems that you have never faced before...
- Trials, testing/temptations that are caused by physical or mental health challenges.
- Trials, testing/temptations that present evil as good and the good way as evil and undesirable.
- These various trials, testings, and temptations require a response...what do we do?
 - James tells us to 'consider it joy!' because your faith is being prooftested; freshly improved and approved. (v3)
 - The trials, testings, and temptations produce patience, endurance, and breeds fortitude.

But let endurance and steadfastness and patience have full play and do a thorough work, so that you may be [people] perfectly and fully developed [with no defects], lacking in nothing. James 1:4 AMPC

- Let endurance, steadfastness, and patience do a thorough work (AMPC)
- "...So you can be fully developed and perfectly equipped." Williams v4)
- But if you lack wisdom (concerning the trials, testings, or temptations, or your maturation in the process, just ask God for wisdom. (v5)
- o "He gives wisdom with an open hand." Weymouth
- "He gives freely to everyone without reproaches." TCNT (v5)
- We need to ask in faith...ask with confidence...'not divided in the mind', not wavering, not disputing with oneself. Transline NT (v6)

• Being double-minded makes you half-hearted!

⁷ For truly, let not such a person imagine that he will receive anything [he asks for] from the Lord, ⁸ [For being as he is] a man of two minds (hesitating, dubious, irresolute), [he is] unstable and unreliable and uncertain about everything [he thinks, feels, decides]. James 1:7-8 AMPC
