COLOSSIANS: LORDSHIP IN OUR RELATIONSHIPS PT 2

Colossians 3:18-21 NASB

¹⁸ Wives, be subject to your husbands, as is fitting in the Lord. ¹⁹ Husbands, love your wives and do not become bitter against them. ²⁰ Children, obey your parents in everything, for this is pleasing to the Lord. ²¹ Fathers, do not antagonize your children, so that they will not become discouraged.

Ephesians 5:17-28 NASB

¹⁷ Therefore do not be foolish but understand what the will of the Lord is. ¹⁸ And do not get drunk with wine, in which there is debauchery, but be filled with the spirit, ¹⁹ speaking to one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody with your hearts to the Lord; ²⁰ always giving thanks for all things in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to our God and Father; ²¹ and subject yourselves to one another in the fear of Christ.

²² Wives, subject yourselves to your own husbands, as to the Lord. ²³ For the husband is the head of the wife, as Christ also is the head of the church, He Himself being the Savior of the body. ²⁴ But as the church is subject to Christ, so also the wives ought to be to their husbands in everything.

²⁵ Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ also loved the church and gave Himself up for her, ²⁶ so that He might sanctify her, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word, ²⁷ that He might present to Himself the church in all her glory, having no spot or wrinkle or any such thing; but that she would be holy and blameless. ²⁸ So husbands also ought to love their own wives as their own bodies. He who loves his own wife loves himself:

- Note: V 17-21 precede V 22-28. (V 21 in particular)
- What does submission mean?
 - The root word here means to arrange, put in order, or establish.
 - Here the word has a prefix that means 'under', so it means to place under or arrange under.
 - Note: 'Home on the arrange' works better than home on the 'dis-arranged' and there are much fewer 'dis-couraging' words!
 - This word for subject, submit, or submission is used in reference to all sorts of relationships.

- Jesus in submission to the Father. (see I Corinthians 15:28)
- Jesus in submission to His parents. (see Luke 2:51)
- Christians in submission to Jesus. (see I Corinthians 15:27, Ephesians 1:22, Philippians 3:21)
- The church in submission to Jesus. (see Ephesians 5:24)
- Angels in submission to Jesus. (see I Peter 3:22)
- Young men in submission to their elders. (see I Peter 5:5)
- Submission is part of so many relational connections.

UNDERSTANDING SUBMISSION

Ephesians 5:18-33, Colossians 3:18-19 NASB

Submission – root word means 'to arrange' or 'put in order.' This word adds the prefix 'under' so it means to place or to arrange under, to subordinate or submit voluntarily.

Sub = under Mission = purpose

God's Mission...God's Purpose



Two people voluntarily under the same mission = submission.

Contending for relationships: embittered or emblazed? (Colossians 3:9-21)

- Check out this spiritual armor: (Colossians 3:9-17)
 - Telling the truth. (v9)
 - Putting on the new self. (v19)
 - Recognition that it's all about Jesus. (v11)
 - Living like we are chosen of God, holy and beloved. (v12)
 - Wearing a heart of compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience.
 - Bearing with one another and forgiving one another. (v13) (See Psalm 18:30-36)
 - Put on love...the prefect bond of unity. (v14)
 - Let peace rule in your heart (whose peace is it?) and be thankful.
 (v15)
 - Let the Word of Christ richly dwell within you with Spiritempowered results. (v16) (See Colossians 3:18-21)
 - Wives, be subject to your husbands as is fitting in the Lord.
 (It is difficult to do what's fitting if you are acting like a misfit. (v18)
 - Husbands, love your wives and do not be embittered against them. (v19)
 - Never treat them harshly...NLT
 - (Don't be) harsh, bitter, resentful. Amplified
 - Husbands, be loving your wives with a divine love which impels you to deny yourselves for their benefit and stop being bitter and harsh to them. Wuest Translation
 - To embitter, exasperate, render angry or indignant, to be embittered or irritated, to visit with bitterness, to grieve. Thayer Translation

If you think you're dying it may be because you've been drinking from bitter waters. **Revelation 8:11**

⁷You husbands in the same way, live with your wives in an understanding way, as with someone weaker, since she is a woman; and show her honor as a fellow heir

of the grace of life, so that your prayers will not be hindered. ⁸ To sum up, all of you be harmonious, sympathetic, loving, compassionate, and humble. I Peter 3:7-8 NASB

- Do this! (I Peter 3:7-8)
 - Live with your life in an understanding way.
 - Understanding her...learn about her...learn from her! (v7)
 - An understanding way (see I Corinthians 12:8, 2:6,10, and 13) wisdom. (v7)
 - Treat her like she is a woman...womanly...feminine...her God-given woman-ness. (This adjective has the same relationship to 'woman' as 'royal' does to king.) (v7)
 - Show her honor...esteem, value. (v7)
 - Don't just think or intend honor...show it...demonstrate her value to you.
 - Pray...she is your joint heir of the grace of life...pray for her and pray with her. (v7)
 - Be harmonious. (v8)
 - Be sympathetic. (v8)
 - Be brotherly (friendly). (v8)
 - Be kindhearted. (v8)
 - Be humble in spirit. (v8)
 - Don't be defensive (evil speech and results). (v9)
 - Be a blesser and a blessing. (v9)
 - Be blessed! (v9)
- A final command. Flame on! Be emblazed!
 - Be on the alert, stand firm in the faith, act like men, be strong. Let all that you do be done in love. I Corinthians 16:13-14
 - The only place this word is used in the Greek NT. It is the verb from of the word 'man'. We need to be about actively being men!
 - Verb = words expressing action, existence or occurrence.
