COLOSSIANS 4: OPEN DOORS, WATCHFUL PRAYER, PRISON CHAINS

Colossians 3:22-24, 4:1-18

²² Slaves, obey those who are your human masters in everything, not with eye-service, as people-pleasers, but with sincerity of heart, fearing the Lord. ²³ Whatever you do, do your work heartily, as for the Lord and not for people, ²⁴ knowing that it is from the Lord that you will receive the reward of the inheritance. It is the Lord Christ whom you serve. ²⁵ For the one who does wrong will receive the consequences of the wrong which he has done, and that without partiality. Colossians 3:22-25 NASB

- Paul instructs those in slavery that they have a heavenly inheritance that is based on faith and not on social class...
- Their work was 'unto the Lord', not just to an earthly master.

Masters, grant your slaves justice and fairness, knowing that you also have a Master in heaven. Colossians 4:1 NASB

• Paul instructs slave owners to treat their slaves justly and fairly, recognizing that they serve their master in heaven and should do it well.

² Devote yourselves to prayer, keeping alert in it with an attitude of thanksgiving; ³ praying at the same time for us as well, that God will open up to us a door for the word, so that we may proclaim the mystery of Christ, for which I have also been imprisoned; ⁴ that I may make it clear in the way that I ought to proclaim it. ⁵ Conduct yourselves with wisdom toward outsiders, making the most of the opportunity. ⁶ Your speech must always be with grace, as though seasoned with salt, so that you will know how you should respond to each person. Colossians 4:2-6 NASB

- Devote yourself to prayer...be earnest, unwearied, and steadfast in your prayer life.
- Be alert and intent in prayer...watchful and aware in praying...
 - o What are you praying?
 - What are you hearing? (Revelation)
 - o Do it all with thanksgiving. (v2)

• Paul asks them to pray for his apostolic team...that God will 'open up a door for the Word they preach.'

"for a wide door for effective service has opened to me, and there are many adversaries." 1 Corinthians 16:9 NASB

• A door for effective service.

"Now when I came to Troas for the gospel of Christ and when a door was opened for me in the Lord." 2 Corinthians 2:12 NASB

- "A door opened for him in the Lord..."
- "I had a wide opportunity in the Lord...Moffat
- "An obvious God-given opportunity." Phillips
- "Even though, in the Lord's providence a door should open before me." Weymouth

⁵ Conduct yourselves with wisdom toward outsiders, making the most of the opportunity. ⁶ Your speech must always be with grace, as though seasoned with salt, so that you will know how you should respond to each person. Colossians 4:5-6

- Be wise towards non-believers...discreet and opportunistic...(being alert in prayer will help you with this!)
- Our approach to non-believers should be pleasant and winsome and our response to them should be laced with grace and 'seasoned with salt'...

⁷ As to all my affairs, Tychicus, our beloved brother and faithful servant and fellow bond-servant in the Lord, will bring you information. ⁸ For I have sent him to you for this very purpose, that you may know about our circumstances and that he may encourage your hearts; ⁹ and with him is Onesimus, our faithful and beloved brother, who is one of your own. They will inform you about the whole situation here. ¹⁰ Aristarchus, my fellow prisoner, sends you his greetings; and also Barnabas' cousin Mark (about whom you received instructions; if he comes to you, welcome him); ¹¹ and also Jesus who is called Justus; these are the only fellow workers for the kingdom of God who are from the circumcision, and they have

proved to be an encouragement to me. ¹² Epaphras, who is one of your own, a bond-servant of Christ Jesus, sends you his greetings, always striving earnestly for you in his prayers, that you may stand mature and fully assured in all the will of God. ¹³ For I testify for him that he has a deep concern for you and for those who are in Laodicea and Hierapolis. ¹⁴ Luke, the beloved physician, sends you his greetings, and Demas does also. Colossians 4:7-14 NASB

- Paul's apostolic team
 - Mostly gentle believers...
 - Tychicus Paul's messenger to the Colossians along with Onesimas. (v7-9)
 - Aristarchus, Paul's fellow prisoner, Mark, with whom Paul has a history, and Justus, all of whom are of Jewish heritage. (10-11)
 - Epaphras...he is a Colossian, and he brought the gospel to the city...Paul describes him as a 'bond servant' of Jesus...He is a true intercessor.
 - He prays consistently for the Colossians, laboring for them in prayer for their spiritual growth and for the fullness of God's will in their lives (v12-14)
 - Luke and Demas are also part of this team...Demas will later desert Paul and the team. (see Acts 16:10) (v14)

¹⁵ Greet the brothers and sisters who are in Laodicea and also Nympha and the church that is in her house. ¹⁶ When this letter is read among you, have it also read in the church of the Laodiceans; and you, for your part, read my letter that is coming from Laodicea. ¹⁷ Tell Archippus, "See to the ministry which you have received in the Lord, so that you may fulfill it." ¹⁸ I, Paul, write this greeting with my own hand. Remember my imprisonment. Grace be with you. Colossians 4:15-18 NASB

- Paul instructs them to have this letter read in their own church and to the house church led by Nympha.
- He entrusts Archippus (Paul's 'fellow soldier', see Philemon 2) to fulfill his call to ministry.
- Finally, Paul reminds them of his 'chains'.
- He signs the letter in his own handwriting and blesses them with a blessing of God's favor and presence.
