Why Is Mission Mobilization Necessary?

- 1/3 of the world's population still live in unreached people groups
- There are now believers in every single country on earth
- Paradigm shift from “mission receiving” to becoming a “mission force”



The Nature of Mobilization – What?

- In its simplest form mobilization is calling the Church back to her core corporate identity
- We are God's multiplying, reproducing, missionary-type people



The Nature of Mobilization – What?

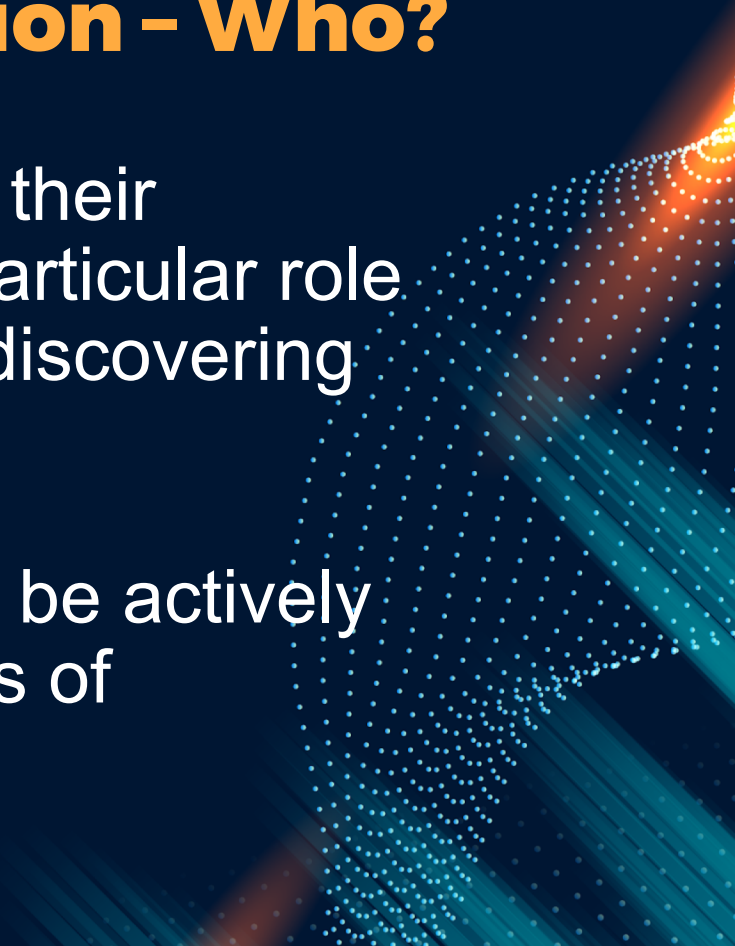
- Matthew 28:18-20 - *“Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them...teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you.”*
- Mark 16:15 - *“Go into all the world and proclaim the gospel to the whole creation.”*

The Nature of Mobilization – What?

- Luke 24:47 - *“And repentance for the forgiveness of sins should be proclaimed to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem and you are witnesses of these things.”*
- John 20:21 - *“Peace to you, as the Father has sent Me, so also I am sending you.”*

The Nature of Mobilization – Who?

- Every disciple is meant to see their redemption as engaged in a particular role in Jesus' Great Commission (discovering roles)
- Every local church is meant to be actively engaged in three distinct levels of "scattering."



The Nature of Mobilization – Who?

Acts 8:1, 4, “At that time a great persecution arose against the church that was at Jerusalem; and they were all scattered throughout the regions of Judea and Samaria, except the apostles...therefore those who were scattered went everywhere preaching the word.”

The Nature of Mobilization – Who?

- Level One Scattering – Into the Local Community
- Level Two Scattering – Among “Near Culture” Unreached Peoples Within 200 or So Miles
- Level Three Scattering – Among “Distant Culture” Unreached Peoples



The Nature of Mobilization – How?

- What if our discipleship process within churches included mobilization as a natural, intertwined, whole?
- 2 Cor. 5:14 - *“For Christ’s love compels us...and He died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for Him who died for them and was raised again.”*

The Nature of Mobilization – How?

- 2 Cor. 5:19 - *“God has reconciled us to Himself and has given us the ministry of reconciliation.”*
- 2 Cor. 5:20 - *“We are therefore Christ’s ambassadors, as though God were making His appeal through us...be reconciled to God.”*

The Nature of Mobilization – How?

- What if a whole church community moved along a journey together of being mobilized by putting proven, strategic mobilization-based tools into the life of their fellowship?
- What if an entire denomination or church network structure could be envisioned to implement systematic mobilization tools church by church?
